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MGJC Blog: Summary of All God's Laws

Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets. (Matthew 22:37-40 KJV)

There are at least 613 laws of God in the Bible and yet, none of us may not able to keep them holy. Even though God understand our limitation, He gave us two simple laws for us to follow: love God and love other people. These two simple laws sum up the Ten Commandments that God gave them to Moses.

Let's forward to our century. Even though our country was founded by Chris-

name of the LORD thy God in vain; for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain. (Exodus: 20:1-7 KJV)

Ten Commandments: Honoring God (Pt. 2)

Thou shalt have no other gods before me. (Exodus 20:3 KJV)

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Ten Commandments: Sabbath Day (Part I)

Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day *is* the sabbath of the LORD thy God: *in it* thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that *is* within thy gates: For *in* six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them *is*, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it. (Exodus 20:8-11 KJV)

I believe the most law that Americans are neglecting today is the Sabbath Day, the day we'd need to give honor to God by resting upon Him. This day of the week should be designated for us to have quality with Him rather than busy ourselves to death. No wonder most of us have some kinds of sicknesses in our bodies. Jesus said in Matthew 6:34, "Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day *is* the evil thereof." Being worrying would bring us to problem in physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually.

God created Sabbath Day for us to rest upon Him. He didn't create us to be His slaves. No! He wants to establish imitate relationship with each of us. We are His and are not belonged to the world. Ten Commandments: Sabbath Day (Part II)

And, behold, there was a man which had *his* hand withered. And they asked him, saying, Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath days? that they might accuse him. And he said unto them, What man shall there be among you, that shall have one sheep, and if it fall into a pit on the sabbath day, will he not lay hold on it, and lift *it* out? How much then is a man better than a sheep? Wherefore it is lawful to do well on the sabbath days. (Matthew 12:10-12 KJV)

As the days of Pharisees, we sometime mixed up God's laws with our moral laws. Even though God said that we'd need to be rested on the seventh day, we'd decide to work more hours and make busy to ourselves. Don't be misunderstood that some of the services need to be available 24/7, such as hospital, grocery stores, gas stations, fire departments, and etc. And some stores could close on the seventh day, such as Wal-mart, restaurants, and etc. Unfortunately, our nation becomes money -maker nation, we may forget how we'd need to rest and refresh our spirits, souls, and bodies.

We often see many people go to the yoga session, Eastern Mysticism religious practice, to try to regenerate their bodies. Without thinking what they are doing, this practice teaches them to reinforce the energy upon themselves. No God. If your church would have yoga session, then your spirit would be risked your relation with God. Yes, there should be relaxing exercise activities for our spirits, souls, and bodies, but it should have limited. We should really need to focus on God and His words. Why not turn on praise and worship music for us to do exercise. Read and meditate on God's Words. Work for God and not just for our needs.

We have limited ourselves to worn our bodies. Do you know why Pharisees saw surprise that Jesus was working on Sabbath Day (Matthew 12:2)? They worried that He'd be breaking their laws. Sabbatical law didn't come from any man. God created the sabbatical law for us to have quality time with Him and people around us. Jesus didn't break the sabbatical law, but He fulfilled it.

The Ten Commandments are not religious laws, but to build our relationship with God and people. This is why Jesus said that we need to love God and other people. It sums up all the laws in the Bible.

Just for Catholics: Sabbath

Ouestion: Catholic writers say that the day of worship was changed from the seventh (Saturday) to the first day of the week (Sunday) by the Catholic Church. I believe we should keep all Ten Commandments, as our Lord did, including the seventh day Sabbath. Some Baptists believe this also. What do you think?

Answer: Most Christians rest from their daily work and meet for worship on Sunday. We do not meet on Saturday because we do not keep the Jewish Sabbath or observe the ceremonial laws that formed part of the Jewish Sabbath, just as we do not observe the other ceremonial regulations of the Mosaic Law. These regulations pointed to and were fulfilled in Christ.

The Sabbath was a sign of God's covenant with the Jews (Exodus 31:13-17). They were commanded to offer two lambs and renew the bread of God's presence in the tabernacle (Leviticus 24:5-9; Numbers 28:9-10). Today, the old covenant with the Jews gave way to a better covenant, the New Testament in Jesus' blood. Therefore the signs of the old covenant (including circumcision, the animal sacrifices, the Jewish feasts and the Sabbath) are now obsolete.


During Jesus' lifetime, the Mosaic Law was still in force, and as expected, he rested on the Sabbath, attended the Jewish synagogue, and participated in the Temple worship and the feasts of the Jews. But after his death and resurrection, the new covenant was established and the old regulations were set aside.

Keeping in mind that the first Christians were devout Jews, we should not be surprised that they initially kept the Jewish customs, including meeting on the Sabbath, circumcision and the dietary laws. The change was gradual but decisive.

The early church was aware of the great change that had taken place. Church historian, Eusebius of Caesarea, writes in the 4th century: 'They (the righteous people who lived before Abraham) did not care about circumcision of the body, neither do we. They did not care about observing Sabbaths, nor do we. They did not avoid certain kinds of food, neither did they regard the other distinctions which Moses first delivered to their posterity to be observed as symbols; nor do Christians of the present day do such things' (Church History, book 1, chapter 4).

These changes had already started in the apostolic church. Indeed, the apostle Paul expressed great concern when he

heard that the Christians in the churches of Galatia were turning back to the old ways. He wrote: 'You observe days and months and seasons and years. I am afraid for you, lest I have labored for you in vain' (Galatians 4:10, 11).



A similar problem arose in the Colossian church. Some teachers were insisting that Christians should observe the Jewish ceremonial laws, including the Sabbath. Paul strongly opposed the idea: 'So let no one judge you in food or in drink, or regarding a festival or a new moon or sabbaths, which are a shadow of things to come, but the substance is of Christ' (Colossians 2:16-17). The Jews had the ceremonies (shadows, symbols, pictures); we have the substance, the reality - Christ himself!

As Christians we should not keep the Jewish Sabbath, but like our forefathers in the faith, we too need the weekly rest, and the Christian community has even more reason to come together and worship God our Saviour.

But why meet on Sunday, the first day of the week?

1. Christians meet on Sunday to mark the glorious day of Jesus' resurrection. "Now after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week began to dawn ... the angel answered and said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said'" (Matthew 28:1-6).

2. The first meeting of the risen Lord with the disciples was on the Sunday. "Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, 'Peace be with you" (John 20:19).

3. The New Testament church was established on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1) which always fell on the day after the Sabbath (Leviticus 23:15-16), that is, Sunday.

4. From the writings of the New Testament we know that the apostolic church met on the first day of the week:

doesn't mean that my life is useless. Instead, God has a greater plan for your and my life that He can use us to show the path of life to others who don't know Jesus Christ.

Following the apostolic example, the early Christians continued to meet and worship on Sunday. We know this from the writings of the early church fathers, for example, Justin Martyr writes about the practice in his days (about 150 AD):

'And on the day called *Sunday*, all who live in cities or in the country gather together to one place, and the memoirs of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read ... But *Sunday is the day on which we all hold our common* the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." There is no sinner prayer formula. Instead, you just talk to God at where you are now. Secondly, I'd like to encourage you to find a good solid biblical teaching church and Christian friends. They can help you to build strong relationship with God.

assembly, because it is the first day on which God, having wrought a change in the darkness and matter, made the world; and Jesus Christ our Saviour on the same day rose from the dead. For He was crucified on the day before that of Saturn (Saturday); and on the day after that of Saturn, which is the day of the Sun, having appeared to His apostles and disciples, He taught them these things, which we have submitted to you also for your consideration' (Justin Martyr, First Apology, 67).

Following the example of the disciples in the apostolic and early churches, most Christians continue to meet on Sunday rather than the seventh day. Those who insist that we must esteem the seventh day above the

'Now on *the first day of the week*, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul, ready to depart the next day, spoke to them and continued his message until midnight' (Acts 20:7). By this time, it was the custom of the Christian church to meet on Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist.'

On *the first day of the week* let each one of you lay something aside, storing up as he may prosper, that there be no collections when I come' (1 Corinthians 16:2). Why would the apostle Paul tell the Christians in Corinth to

rest and observe the Sabbath according to the Law of Moses are causing unnecessary divisions and tension among God's people.
